

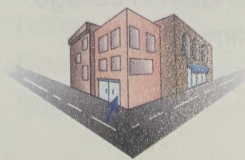

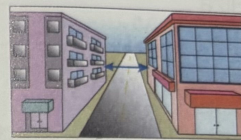

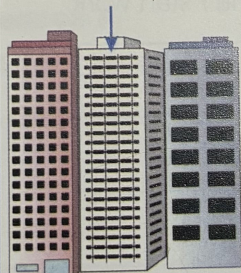
Prepositions of Place



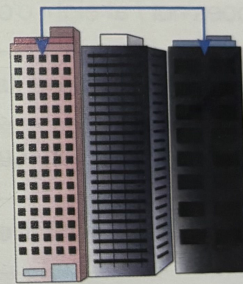
